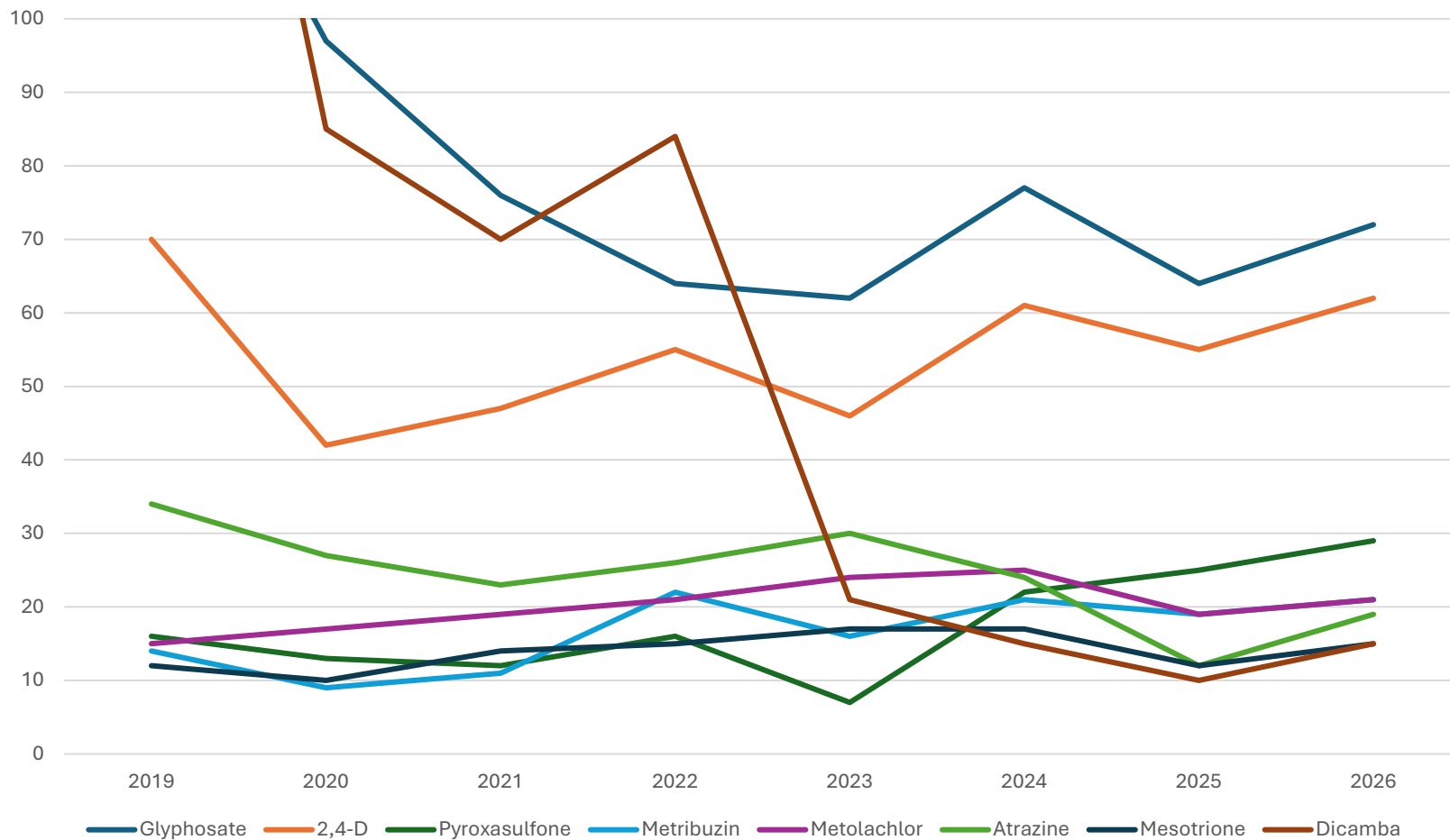

2021	Glyphosate (76), Dicamba (70) , 2,4-D (47), Atrazine (23), Metolachlor (19),

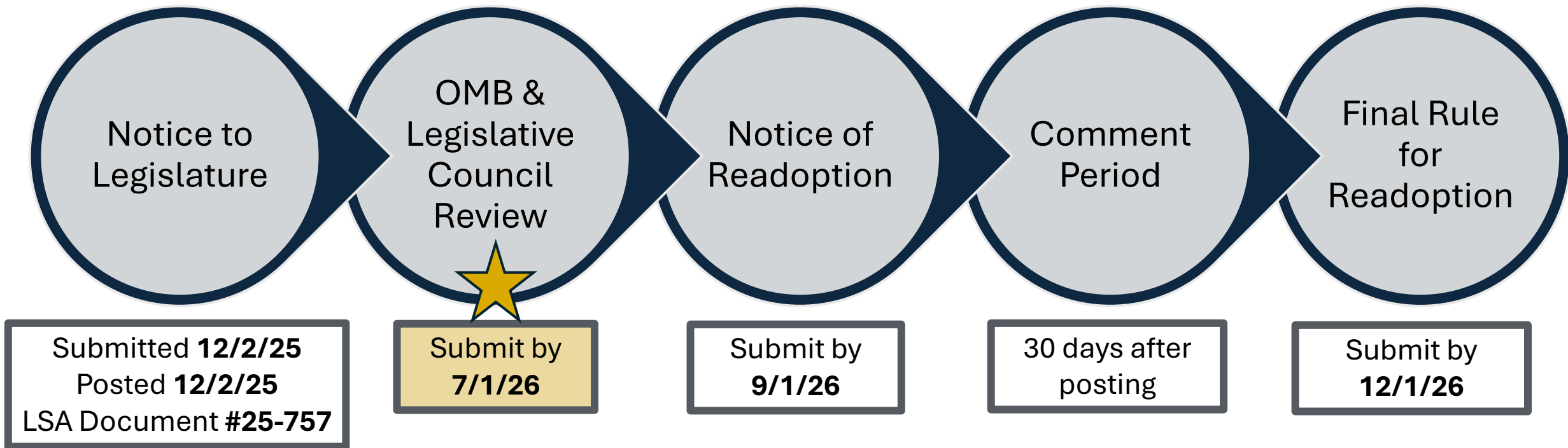

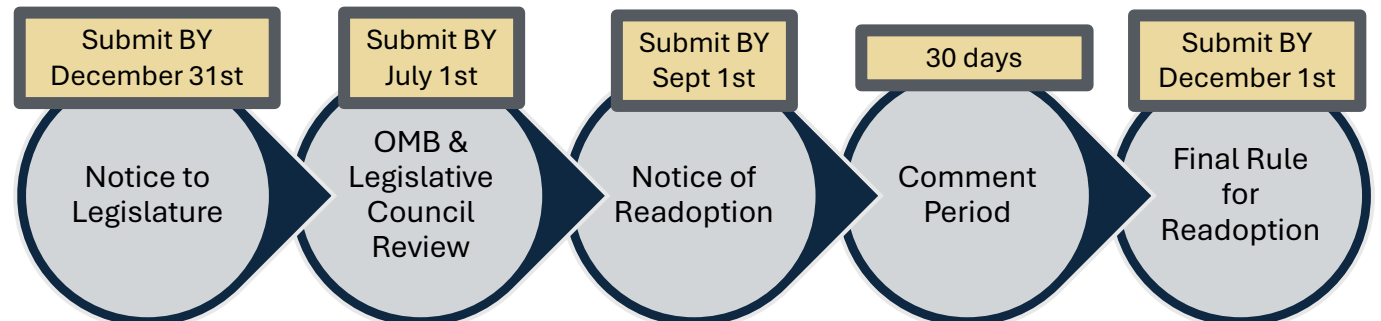

Basic Overview of Rule Readoption Timeline



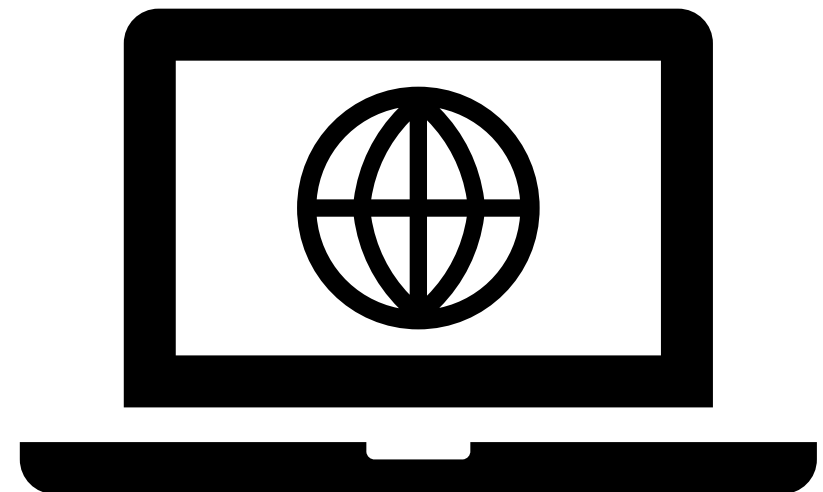

Out of State Aerial Applicator Reciprocity

- As an exception to Indiana's reciprocity requirements.
 - OISC previously allowed out-of-state aerial applicators employed by **Indiana-based** businesses to qualify for Indiana licensure using their home state's certification examinations rather than completing Indiana's certification examinations.
- To comply with Indiana's pesticide certification and licensing regulation.
- Effective January 1, 2027, this policy exception will be discontinued.

Out of State Aerial Applicator Reciprocity

- To comply with Indiana's pesticide certification and licensing requirements.
- Any aerial applicator who resides outside Indiana and is employed by, or seeking employment with, an Indiana-based pesticide business must:
 - Successfully complete the **Indiana Core** examination and the **Category 11 – Aerial Application** examination before an Indiana applicator license can be issued.
- **OISC will still allow out-of-state companies to apply for business and applicator reciprocity, providing the business is located outside of Indiana.**
